We have been raising funds for this over the last few years and as we have now collected over £30,000 + a £10,000 beguest we believe the time is right to apply for grants and to commence a first phase of the works. Ask any of the agencies in Gravesend "where work is done for the vulnerable in the community" and they will say the Methodist Church. However, buildings like ours designed in the late 1800's do not meet the aspirations of a 21st century congregation and community. As a result we hope to rework the layout of the rooms to the rear of the church to enable use by, and for, the town centre community 7 days a week, but which is presently impossible. Improvements are essential if we are to be a thriving community based church for the future.
