Epiphany: The visit by the Wise men from the East to the household. Matt 2: 1 – 15.

We think of it being the Kings (Melchior, Casper & Balthazar) but in fact there is no reference to there being three.

The weekly lectionary in the Anglican Church we have Sundays after Epiphany where as in Methodism Epiphany is rather lost as they follow the start of Sundays in ordinary time. I remember when I was young, helping separate the Sunday school stamps into weeks from a big sheet for each child for the year. The fact that Easter is a movable feast as you know meant that the number of Epiphany weeks in the year were adjusted by the number of Trinity Sundays so that the whole year readings were correct. The weekly stamps had to follow the pattern. It taught me the Christian year in the process.

A slight diversion on the visit that has now happened (as you read this) and all the lights, cards and decorations packed away for next year. I noticed on my daily walks around my locality that come Boxing Day, lights were gone in some households. (There is word more used in this time of the Virus).

Christmas over and done with. But not for us we keep going for the visit of those wise men. A later event of adoration as they found the house by following the star. Astronomer's now think it was a conjunction of the planets of Jupiter and Saturn that created the star of the time. Too much cloud cover for us to see it recently some days ago for a very rare occasion.

It must have been strange for Mary and Joseph to have these travellers turn up at their door after some time after the birth. There is no time factor included in our biblical references. Who are these people but they have precious gifts? I wonder what these gifts would be in our age? Thankfully not large and awkward gifts to pack and take with them on their move to Egypt. Could this be to provide us with the feeling that we need to give something to baby Jesus regardless of whether we are rich or poor. Brings to mind the last line of "in the bleak mid-winter" The necessity to travel is also featured. This year something which is emphasised by our not meeting others from other households and consequently not travelling at all.

On a personal note as a household we moved to Lower Halstow after Christmas in 1973 so that Dad could take up his new Ministry and be licensed at a service in Upchurch Church on the eve of Epiphany. A special and memorable time for us, saying farewell to friends and taking on new challenges in that New Year.

This year again, we all have differing challenges to face, but with God's love and his Holy Spirit we can rise to them and be successful I hope.
