Reflection 1 Samuel 3:1-10; Psalm 139, John 1: 43-51

I remember my initial training course to join the Archery club. There was so much theory but it also included (thankfully) shooting practice. Each of us had a mentor and his job was to watch, with his experienced eyes, our every move. My mentor was a policeman in active service, by profession, so you can imagine he was very competent at professionally observing people. While my mentor was with me I scored really well. But when he left me and went to instruct someone else I lost concentration and my arrows flew all over the place.

Today's readings are about Samuel, David and Nathanael. Each of them experienced just how profoundly God knows them. Nothing escapes his eyes. Well, we all kind of know about this, but tend not to think too much about it. The saying, "Nothing is hidden under the sun", refers to society's ability to observe and gossip. We more likely prefer our lives to be private, with personal space reserved, and disclosed only with our permission, (we are all under constant pressure of social media publicity). In God's eyes our private, even intimate, existence is not to be published in the tabloids. It helps us find the best reflection of ourselves. Just as if you go to the doctor. Please tell him the truth. There is no point making yourself appear nicer than you are.

And there is even more! God knows you better than you know yourself. How often do we need a good friend to tell us how silly or how great we really are, because we cannot see it ourselves. So God is our best doctor and friend because he can tell us a lot about ourselves. All in its time so it doesn't kill us.

God's presence in each of our lives can be a bit scary, but knowing that our God is a good and compassionate Father helps us to focus and shoot all of our arrows into the centre. Both Samuel and Nathanael's experience had a surprise element. It is one thing to be aware of something as a general possibility and another thing to be confronted like that on a personal level. This makes a huge difference. Unless we are called by name, we remain just a number, undefined statistics. We need to hear our name. Then it starts to be serious. It is not true what so many people claim that they never heard God speaking to them. Even Samuel did not believe God is speaking to him and it took him time to realise. Thank God he does it in such a variety of ways that no one is excluded.

"In the past times God spoke through the prophets to our ancestors in many times and many ways.
