### Reflection on God's word Mark 10:46-52; Hebrews 7:23-28

Reading the text from Hebrews we may ask: "what is the role of the priest?" Can we say he stands between God and people? The ancient role and our modern understanding of priesthood have changed a lot but the very principle remains the same. The question is who qualifies for such a role? The Old Testament priesthood had extremely strict and detailed requirements. Yet we can see how great men of God, despite all their fame, often fall. Again and again. No one's integrity is perfect, that is for sure.

The New Testament teaching **1Peter 2** calls Christians a royal priesthood. But our high priest, the real priest is Jesus. We are just vessels of his grace. Christ stands in the presence of the Lord and intercedes for all and in the same time he dwells in our hearts and speaks the living word of God to our lives. He is full of integrity and has not compromised himself to the temptation of this world, yet he can understand our pains because he was there himself.

So how can we approach this high priest? Here we could point towards prayer in its variety from praising, thanksgiving, adoration, proclamation, intercession, confession etc. Or we could add studying scriptures, worship in the church, receiving sacraments, bringing sacrifices. These are all channels through which his grace flows to our lives. As much as these are available they often feel too abstract or super spiritual and we may often feel disconnected. Then we envy the stories like blind Bartimeus who could meet Jesus in the flesh and receive his grace. But this man was blind! His senses were tuned to connect with the world in a way which can be a lesson to us as we sometimes struggle to see Jesus. He had to listen, he had to wait, he had to keep awake not to miss the chance, and when Jesus was close, others discouraged him. Perhaps his blindness helped him to hear and sense that Jesus is about, even though he could not see him. We perhaps see too much and are unable to hear and sense that Jesus is near to us. He is approachable. He even said to Thomas, one of the apostles: John 20:29 *"you believe because you see me? Blessed are those who do not see and yet believe"* When we pray we tent to close our eyes, perhaps like Bartimeus to see better that Jesus is near.
