Bible readings: Psalm 34: 1-10; Matthew 5:1-12; 1John 3:1-6

Reflection

"Taste and see that the Lord is good"- this statement from psalm 34 is a **confession and an invitation** at the same time.

In terms of confession we have to look behind the scene. Psalm 34 refers to the episode of David's life, when he was pretending to be insane in order to save his life from King Saul. This story somehow doesn't fit our imagination of what a biblical hero should look like. David in his right mind sees no other way to survive the day! First he put others in danger and made them pay with their own lives for his rescue. Then he pretends insanity to gain pardon from the king whose soldiers he was killing on the battle field.

I am sure as time passed on and David remembered what he did he did not feel proud of himself. Nobody would.

This certainly takes away our naive understanding of how God works. How he can make *"such a wreck like me holy "* Despite his evil actions, David remains in the cloud of witnesses who are preserved for us to see what God can do in people's lives.

At a closer look into the writing of this psalm we have to see that David is not saying "taste and see how great a person I am". He is saying: "taste and see how good God is". He is as good as we are bad. This is an integral part of the Good news we proclaim to the rest of the world. We are fools but God is good. That is the confession of every genuine follower of Christ. Even the apostle Paul didn't hesitate to say it about himself.

"Taste and see that the Lord is good" is also an invitation to experience what God is like. As much as this sounds like a friendly and kind invitation in every case it will be a very dramatic experience. Once you taste and see what the living God is like you will never be the same person. This invitation is a serious business and perhaps we are not always fully aware that God in his wisdom has chosen us to carry it. He has placed an entire nation in history to demonstrate what he is like. Now he has his disciples and the church to be the agent of his presence.

How can anyone taste and see Gods' goodness? Perhaps some of you are familiar with the popular TV series "Eat well for less". An important part of the program is when Greg Wallace and Chris Bavin bring new brands of food to replace the ones used by the family and they taste the samples. Many times they face the challenge of fussy eaters and people convinced that they can't change their eating habits. After a week of tasting and seeing what they like, the true brands and prices are revealed. It is a moment of surprise. Sometimes it takes a lot to encourage children to eat the right food, or change eating habits. But the team is doing a great job helping people to do it.

Encouraging people to taste and see that God is good is also not easy and can be very disheartening when everybody declares that they don't want to change, don't feel the need to change, the way they live their lives. It often comes from example. In the same way that we encourage children to eat brussels sprouts by eating them ourselves so we can invite people to meet God by our own example of how important He is to us first.

In Scripture food and eating is important too. In a literal and in a symbolic way the truth about God and man are often presented to us at the table. Sometimes we are like children, not believing that broccoli could by any chance taste nice. It takes a life, a committed life to Jesus, to say: "taste and see that the Lord is good" Where do you stand today? Are you at the point in your life where you need to accept this invitation and see for yourself personally that God is good? Perhaps you have already tasted and seen God's goodness and you need to invite someone else to "taste and see". But no matter where we feel we stand on the imaginary scale of holiness, it is not our greatness but his work in our lives which brings that special flavour to life. We might not feel proud of ourselves, or worthy to offer the invitation, but we have every reason to boast in Jesus. "Taste and see that the Lord is good"

The Apostles' teaching about the fruit of the Holy Spirit falls well into this train of thought.

(kindness, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol).

Reconnected to God we are made holy, set apart to bear witness to His majesty. It is the work of his spirit that causes us to produce fruit which is for the healing of the nations.
