QUARANTINE REFLECTION 18 - PENTECOST

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I woke this morning with those words running in my head and there it has stayed; I was awake for a good couple of hours before I'd realised how very apt the words and indeed the whole song is for today.



For some it will be really frightening and some will be very nervous. Some will go at it enthusiastically and rush around wanting to meet and greet loved ones. I guess for most us we approach this new freedom, the beginning of the new normal with some caution but with I imagine excitement and anticipation.

It would be lovely to being going to church and celebrating with my fellow brothers and sisters in Christ to share in the joy and singing celebrating the Church's birthday. We will celebrate we will share together but we will be doing it from the comfort of our homes.

And as our country relaxes the lockdown rules and people return to in some part how life was but will never likely be as it was we as a church and Christians should be perhaps taking the opportunity to consider how we are going to move forward in faith, with our advocate to be Christ in our communities and to continue to be Church with some of how we used to be but inclusive of how we are now and how we will be in the future.

Challenging times ahead but I hope exciting and fruitful too and I think I am looking forward to exploring how my new normal moving forward with the Holy Spirit for and with Jesus might be. I hope and I pray that you will journey with us and we can find our new normal together.
