News from Strood (Peninsular)

The Karibuni Trust is a UK registered charity which aims to raise awareness about the plight of children living on the streets and in the slums of Kenya and to raise money to support projects to meet their needs. It was started 20 years ago by Corinne Murphy, a teenager who, after a severe head injury, had a vision of African children asking for help. News from Hextable

We are still very conscious of Rev Velma Campbell's poor health and hope it will be not too long now before she gets the medical treatment she needs to resolve her health problems and will be back leading services throughout the Circuit.

Hosting Roughshod, part of Riding Lights Theatre Company, in March was a new venture for us. We didn't know how things would pan out. Their final programme had them performing at a wide variety of locations and groups. We started with a welcome tea for the group when they arrived on the Sunday, followed by our evening service lead by Rev Gary Watt, where they gave us a taster of what was to come by performing their Zaccheus sketch. Gary was very encouraging to the group and praised the work they were doing. At Hextable, they took a workshop for our older Boys' and Girls' Brigade members which centred on social justice and had them all thinking a little more deeply about things we all take for granted such as smart phones, flat screen TVs and the conditions they are made under, in places like China. They also performed some of their sketches to our Parent and Toddler group mainly for the benefit of the parents but engaged the toddlers as well. We were delighted to have over a hundred attend the show they put on at the end of the week having also performed at Gillingham and 3rd Bromley GB on previous evenings. All those attending were amazed by their very professional performance and strong message put over in the sketches which came one after the other in two hours of performing. Topics covered were William Wilberforce and the slave trade, Sister Megan Rice's protest at a major US nuclear base, the regime in North Korea, Christian Persecution and their own testimonies on life as well as biblical based sketches. They left to a standing ovation.

Roughshod were able to give workshops or performances in Prisons on Sheppey where they had some very emotional responses, schools, clubs and the Dartford Cold Weather Project. This was very much an outreach project to our local area which we hope many will have benefitted from.

The Ecumenical Lent courses through the local Churches Together based on the Praise Him, York Course were attended by many of our members and well received. The next event is an Election Hustings hosted by St. Peter's Church where it is hoped to put a Christian input/concerns into the Election discussions.

On Sunday 19th July we have our Circuit Farewell service for our Co-superintendent Rev Clifford Newman and also Rev John Yap from our Chinese Church in Gillingham. This will be at 4pm at Union Street Methodist Church in Maidstone. Although we are all very sad that they are leaving, we hope that this will be a real time of celebration of their ministries with us.

Finally, do join us again on Sunday 30th August at 4pm at Union Street, as we welcome Rev Bonni-Belle Pickard as our new Co-superintendent and Rev Kan Yu who is coming as a probationer minister to the Chinese Church, and also serving in other Circuit churches.

Local Preacher Training. How wonderful for our Circuit to be receiving five new Local Preachers coming on full plan, and hopefully another two later this year! This has been a long and rigorous few years for Sara, Derek, Irene, Eddie and Colin. They have been studying Faith and Worship for the last four years or so, with fourteen in depth assignments submitted, plus four Worship Portfolios. Each of these includes two exegesis passages (in depth exploration of a Bible passage, as if preparing for a sermon), a reflection on a service they have attended, a report by one of more Local Preachers or minister on a service they have led, including a transcript of their sermon, their own reflection on the service and points for future development. They have had several services reported on, and have received positive, and sometimes not so positive feedback on all they have done. They have had to learn to be quite tough-skinned. And they have survived! They would not have done so without the support and encouragement of many of you. They haven't finished yet though, as they all still have to complete Unit 18, a study of their own choice, which will be presented to a future Local Preachers' and Worship Leaders' Meeting. Please continue to encourage them in their ministry.

Worship: Leading and Preaching. This is the name of the new course which will soon take over from both Faith and Worship, and the present Worship Leader training. The new course is up-to-date, challenging, inspiring and also flexible to allow for different abilities and interests. I have felt privileged to be involved as tutor, with three of our Local Preachers in training, plus others from the South East District. We cannot accept new people on to the pilot but if anyone is interested in joining the course when it runs out as a non-pilot, which may be later this year or early next year, please do speak to me. The course is also suitable as a refresher course for accredited Local Preachers and for personal interest or development.
