

Hellos & Good





His voice and vision have also enriched Connexional projects like *Soul Food, Bible Month, and Sticky Theology,* inspiring many across the Methodist Church in Britain.

Through it all, Oscar's deep joy was evident whenever someone turned to Christ: "Praise the Lord!" was his constant refrain. He served with joy, integrity, and an unshakable belief in the transforming power of the Gospel.

And while Oscar poured himself into ministry, his beloved wife Tara was also completing her doctorate in Theology; a testimony to their shared commitment to God's calling.

We are delighted to celebrate Oscar's next step in ministry as he has been accepted to begin ordination training at Queen's College in September 2025. Although it saddens us to see





him leave our Circuit and the Chinese congregation, we rejoice in knowing that God is leading him into even greater service.

Although Karen has been part of the children and youth setup for as long as many of us can remember, she officially stepped into the role of Youth Pastor in 2022. Since then, Karen has made the role her own, bringing her unique blend of energy, creativity, and faith to everything she does.

From day one, Karen has thrown herself wholeheartedly into the work. Whether it's organising and running the bi-weekly youth club, launching a youth Bible study, leading craft afternoons, or heading up the holiday club, she does it all with a sense of purpose and joy that's infectious. Her passion for helping young people grow in faith and community is obvious, and it shines through in everything she plans and leads.

In the early years, Karen worked closely with the Chinese youth pastor, exploring ways to unite the two groups through youth activities and combined services. In their first year, they led a joint Christingle service.

Karen has also worked hard behind the scenes, especially with the Sunday squads. She's brought greater consistency in teaching across the different groups, ensuring that the young people are not only engaged but also spiritually nourished. She's encouraged and equipped our volunteer leaders to take active roles, making sure that youth ministry is a team effort, grounded in shared responsibility and vision.

One of Karen's standout qualities is her boundless enthusiasm. Whether she's chatting with a toddler, organising games for teens, or helping set up chairs before a service, she brings the same level of energy and positivity.

Her warmth makes her easy to approach, and her enthusiasm and energy often fill the church with life, reminding us that faith isn't just serious, but also full of joy.



Another area where Karen has made a big impact is in leading our All-Age Worship services. These can be challenging moments to get right, balancing the needs of young children with adults and older members of the congregation but Karen seems to do it effortlessly. Her ability to connect with all ages, from toddlers to grandparents, is truly a gift.

She communicates the gospel clearly and creatively, often using visual storytelling or creative interactive moments that draw everyone in. These services have become a highlight for many in Third Avenue and reflect her deep understanding of how to make worship both meaningful and accessible. Beyond her official duties, Karen's presence is a blessing in countless unseen ways. She takes time to listen. She prays for the young people. She celebrates their victories and stands with them in their struggles. She is not just a youth pastor, she is a mentor, a friend, a guide, and a role model of what it looks like to follow Jesus in everyday life.

Rocky's story



Hello! My name is Rocky, and I'm married to my beautiful wife Gisela. We have two incredible boys, Asher and Levi, ages four and two. We've just recently moved from Birmingham Queen's Foundation to here in North Kent, and we're excited to meet new people, share stories, and discover God's blessings in our lives. So, to begin, let me introduce myself and how I have become a probationer minister!

I grew up in a Pentecostal church in the bustling metropolis of Hong Kong, where my dad helped the church's mission among the older and my mum involved in the church's children and family mission. I was inspired by the many backgrounds, stories, and life experiences of people. The more I hear, the more questions I have... "If God is all-powerful, why are there disease and suffering, and wars?" But so often, in the midst of these stirrings of curiosity and questions, I can never underestimate the company of my loved ones, as I recall my mum's soft voice, "My dearest, God has the best plan for you, so just trust in God in all circumstances".

With family encouragement, I was excited to start high school and live independently in the UK, a foreign land. There had been challenges, so I turned to prayer and the Bible for peace and guidance. After a few years, I helped start a Christian fellowship at school with other students. It was important to be part of a Christian community that was supportive, honest, and prayerful. This was especially important to me when my loved one died from illness in early age, and I will never forget the unexpected support from others. It was a really painful moment, but it also taught me to cherish each day that God has given me.

High school results day can be a pivotal moment for many students. Although I didn't meet the requirements for my first-choice university, they didn't immediately reject me and placed me on their waiting list. After hours of waiting, I was devastated and cried out to God, "Lord, if I get into that university, I'll work my lungs out for you!!" Within the next two minutes, the university confirmed my enrolment. Of course, God doesn't always respond to our pleas right now, but I have grown to believe that, despite our human limitations, God's grace is enough. And I remember my prayer from that day.

After graduation, I dedicated my first full year of work to God, so I joint the Chinese Methodist Churches in Durham, Newcastle, and Middlesbrough as a lay worker. The initial one-year commitment was extended to six years, followed by ministerial training recently. Life in the Methodist Church has been an exciting journey, as I've discovered more about the Church over the years from local churches, Circuits, Districts, Connexion, and beyond. I'm motivated to do what I do with the desire to carry on the spiritual torch, alongside many devout Christians, ministers and leaders, and to take part in different aspects of God's calling for us.
