RULES

- 1. Entry fees are as follows; 50p per entry except group entries which are £2.00 per entry. Entry forms should reach the Eisteddfod organiser with the fees by 24th January 2015. ENTRY FEES ARE NON_RETURNABLE. CHEQUES SHOULD BE MADE PAYABLE TO "Eisteddfod St. John's"
- 2. Age of competitor will be as on 1st January 2015
- 3. Competitors must be members of a recognised METHODIST ORGANISA-TION in the area or an LEP
- 4. Entries in classes 32-48 and 68-71 must be sent to the Eisteddfod organiser by 15th February 2015
- 5 All entries other than musical or scripture reading must be at St. John's Methodist Church by 9.30am on the morning of the Eisteddfod.
- 6 INSURANCE: Although every effort is taken to protect entries, it must remain the Entrants responsibility.
- 7 A copy of all "own choice" pieces MUST be provided for the adjudicator
- 8 .COMPETITORS WHO EXCEED TIME LIMITS IN "OWN CHOICE"
- CLASSES WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.
- 9 In all handicraft classes, sizes and dimensions stated in the syllabus MUST be adhered to, but the adjudicators decision is final
- 10 Adjudicators are requested to select an outright winner in each class. NO JOINT WINNERS will be accepted.
- 11. Competitors must be ready to compete when their names are called. If a competitor is engaged in another class the steward must be informed.
- 12. Competitors are recommended to provide their own accompanist or backing track. An Eisteddfod accompanist can be made available if copy of music is provided before the day.
- 13. SOME WINNERS OF CLASSES WILL BE INVITED TO PERFORM AT THE EVENING CELEBRATION.
