Shalom—24/7 Prayer

Thank you for getting involved with the 24/7 Lockdown Prayer Week. I have sensed a nudging from God over the last few weeks that I should find a way to bring the Christians of Sheppey together to pray for our world, nation and island at this difficult time. Obviously, during a global pandemic we cannot physically join together in prayer but we most definitely can in a spiritual sense.

I sense that God wants to move powerfully among us and through us as channels of his peace.

I have had a word stuck in my head for several weeks now—it's the word 'Shalom'

Many are familiar with the Hebrew word shalom or "peace." The common western definition of peace is — the absence of conflict or war — but in Hebrew it means so much more.

"Shalom" is taken from the root word shalam, which means, "to be safe in mind, body, or estate." It speaks of completeness, fullness, or a type of wholeness.

True biblical shalom refers to an inward sense of completeness or wholeness.

I believe that God wants each of us to know the depth of His peace. To know the inner tranquility that he alone can bring. As we seek God's face in prayer I know that we will be blessed.

Numbers 6:24 –26 is my prayer for each of us as we set time aside in prayer.

I also believe that God wants us to pray this prayer of blessing for others. That those He lays on our hearts may know the depths of God's peace—his inner wholeness and tranquility.

There are many people who are feeling overwhelmed with sadness, worry and despair at this time. Some who feel consumed by fear, others who have never experienced loneliness or tiredness like they are feeling at the moment.

As Churches we have an incredible message of hope, love , salvation, peace and light to share with our world even in the most darkest of situations.

John 1:5 says "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

During our 24-7 Prayer week we will pray as God guides us for our world to know the fullness of God and to experience his 'Shalom'

United in Prayer

I firmly believe in the power of prayer. God calls us to seek his face. James 4:8 reminds us that as we take time to draw near to God, so he draws near to us.

2 Chronicles 7:14-15 says " If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayers offered in this place." God wants us to come to him in honest , heartfelt prayer. He loves it when we stand together in unity—I firmly believe that a 24-7 week of prayer at this time will bless God, bless us and bless our world.

Psalm 133 says

How good and pleasant it is

when God's people live together in unity! It is like precious oil poured on the head, running down on the beard, running down on Aaron's beard, down on the collar of his robe. It is as if the dew of Hermon were falling on Mount Zion. For there the Lord bestows his blessing, even life forevermore.

Suggestions on how to pray

- Pray as God leads you to, by his Holy Spirit
- All of us are from different Church traditions,. Pray as you feel comfortable,. God delights when we choose to spend time in his presence.
- Take time to listen to God as well as bringing your requests to God in prayer.
- Meditate on words of Scripture and allow God's Holy Spirit to speak to you afresh through his Word.
- Keep a piece of paper and a pen nearby to jot down anything that God lays on your heart. • For those feeling isolated and lonely

God of compassion, be close to those who are ill, afraid or in isolation. In their loneliness, be their consolation; in their anxiety, be their hope; in their darkness, be their light; through him who suffered alone on the cross, but reigns with you in glory, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Psalm 34:18

The Lord is close to the broken-hearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit

• For parents struggling to help their children though this difficult season of life.

Lord we pray for families with children at home. God, help parents to be patient and creative in these days. May kindness and gentleness be felt in every home. Help those who feel out of their depth trying to homeschool their children, give them wisdom and confidence. For parents who cannot stay home from work, assure them that you are with them and that you care for their families. Give children and young people struggling with the stress and uncertainty of this time and their parents a deep sense of your peace. Amen

- For all those trying to work out how to safely move out of lockdown and get the country up and running again— For our local schools, businesses, charities, faith groups, local government and other organisations.
- For the Church—that we may boldly share the good news of Jesus, his light & life in these difficult days. That we may lovingly care for one another and remain united in Christ when required to physically distance. That our words and actions may glorify God.

• For those struggling with their mental health at this time, some people are feeling overwhelmed with fear and anxiety. Pray that they would know God's deep peace. Pray also for the medical practitioners and other organisations who are seeking to support people who are struggling with their mental health.

Keep us, good Lord, under the shadow of your mercy in this time of uncertainty and distress. Sustain and support the anxious and fearful, and lift up all who are brought low; that we may rejoice in your comfort knowing that nothing can separate us from your love in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

• For those affected by domestic abuse - pray for protection and external help and support. There are several organisations in our own locality who seek to support victims of domestic abuse, let's pray for them.

We pray dear Lord for those who are suffering physical, emotional, economic or sexual abuse in their own homes, may they be guided to help, support and safety. May they know God's love and know that they are not alone and be enabled to live in peace. Amen

Psalm 9:9 says

Ephesians 6:18 says

"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."

Suggested prayer topics & some written prayers

• For the NHS & Other Key workers

Naturally we will want to spend time praying for all the NHS workers , care workers, and other keyworkers who are sacrificially serving others .

Gracious God, give skill, sympathy and resilience to all who are caring for the sick, and your wisdom to those searching for a cure. Strengthen them with your Spirit, that through their work many will be restored to health; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

• For those who are unwell or have been bereaved.

Merciful God, we entrust to your tender care those who are ill or in pain, knowing that whenever danger threatens your everlasting arms are there to hold them safe. Comfort and heal them, and restore them to health and strength; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

For all those who woke this morning to the loneliness of bereavement – the empty bed or chair, an unaccustomed

quietness, a life now incomplete – may they know your presence in the stillness of the day, and through the love of friends who offer their condolence. And in the darker moments may they reach out to hold your hand_and feel the warmth of the One who has already passed from death to life to welcome others into God's Kingdom. Amen
